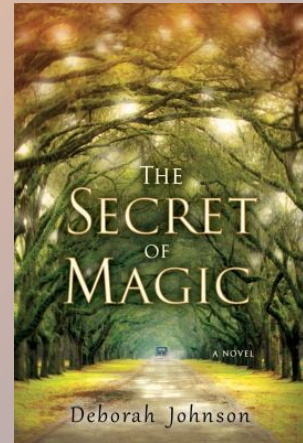

To Kill a Mockingbird by Harper Lee (PB Lee, H.)

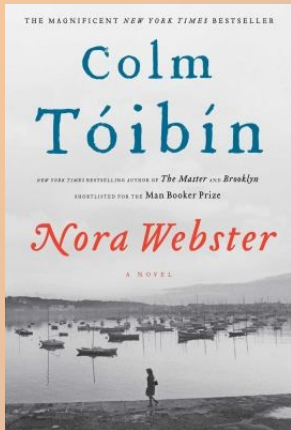
The classic book also written by Harper Lee.
