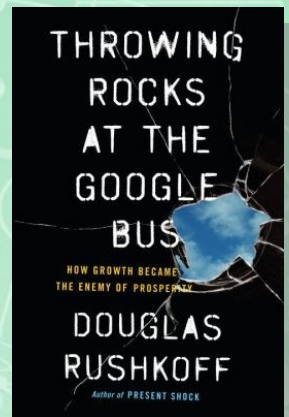
Throwing Rocks at the Google Bus by Douglas Rushkoff (303 . 48 RUS)
