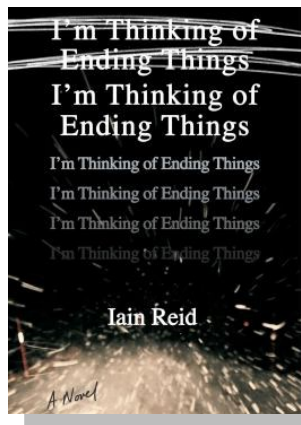
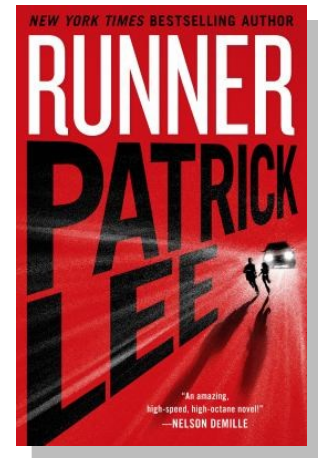
Puppet Master by Dale Brown (FIC BROWN, D.)
